Sensei Craig Dunn will illuminate his interpretation of "*Go Waza no Shosa*", roughly translated as "details of square (or fundamental) technique".

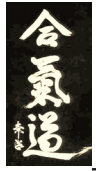
Saturday, May 9, 2015 from 10:30 AM to 1:00 PM

Dunn-Sensei will lead us in an exploration of "*Jyu Waza no Zaidan*", - "foundations of circular (or flowing) technique".



Sensei Craig Dunn

Sensei Craig Dunn began his study of Aikido in 1978. He spent several years at **Ten Shin Dojo** in Osaka, Japan as "*uchi deshi*" under Sensei Steven Seagal. In 1981, he relocated to Taos, New Mexico with Sensei Seagal to build **Ten Shin Bu Gei Gakuen** (Ten Shin School of Martial Arts). In 1983, Sensei Seagal relocated to Los Angeles to pursue his film career and Dunn-Sensei continued chief instructor at the Dojo in Taos. In 2012, Dunn-Sensei severed ties with Seagal-Sensei and rejoined his Sempai, Haruo Matsuoka-Sensei, under the **Doshino-kai** banner. Sensei Craig Dunn continues to be the resident chief instructor of **Aikido Taos Kihon Dojo**.
